God is faithful to take special note of those who serve Him. Of all the promises He has made to His servants, one stands out as my favorite:

For God is not unjust so as to forget your work and the love which you have shown toward His name, in having ministered and in still ministering to the saints. (Hebrews 6:10)

The writer is talking to Christians. The word "beloved" in the previous verse (6:9) assures us of that. And he is writing out of concern for a few of the first-century believers who had begun to cool off and drift from a close walk with God. He wants to encourage them to stay at it, to keep going, to count on the Lord their God to take notice of them and reward them accordingly.

In other words, he reminds them of that great truth all of us tend to forget when days turn into a slow grind: God is faithful! He uses eight words to convey this fact: "God is not unjust so as to forget."

What does it mean to say that God is faithful? It means He is steadfast in His allegiance to His people. He will not leave us in the lurch. It also means He is firm in His adherence to His promises. He keeps His word. Faithfulness suggests the idea of loyalty; dependability; constancy; being resolute, steady, and consistent.

Thank you, church, for serving, and God is faithful to reward your service! Keep serving!

1 John 5:1-5- "Whoever believes that Jesus is the Christ is born of God, and whoever loves the Father loves the child born of Him. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and observe His commandments. For this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments; and His commandments are not burdensome. For whatever is born of God overcomes the world; and this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith. Who is the one who overcomes the world, but he who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?"

The great truth in this is that it is not by our own strength we follow Christ! The second verse of "A Mighty Fortress is Our God" states it very well:

Did we in our own strength confide, our striving would be losing Were not the right man on our side, the man of God's own choosing Dost ask who that may be, Christ Jesus it is He

Lord Sabaoth His name, from age to age the same, and He must win the battle Remember, His commandments are not burdensome. As Philippians 4:13 states, "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me." And to add to the "pool" illustration from above- sometimes my friends and I would try to create a flow against the current of the pool. It was difficult, but if we had enough friends working together, we could make a huge difference. May we as a church strive to go against the flow together as we depend on Christ for our strength.
