There will be no message in the clouds urging you to take a stand. Nor will a flash of lightning awaken you in the midst of your sleep. It doesn't work like that, so don't sit around waiting. Numerous needs and issues surround us. They summon us to stand up and be counted. While we will not be able to respond to all of them, the solution is not to respond to none of them! So let me ask you: What are you doing to stand up, to stand alone, to answer the call of God in this hour?

Not until you believe one person can make a difference will you be willing to take a risk. Quit being so careful about protecting your own back. Stop worrying about what others will think. You don't answer to them. You answer to Him. He will help. He will give you wisdom and courage. You may be only one, but maybe you are the one He is calling to the task. So, take a risk!

#### Calming the Storm

Jonah 1:10-13- Then the men became extremely frightened, and they said to him, "How could you do this?" For the men knew that he was fleeing from the presence of the LORD, because he had told them. So they said to him, "What should we do to you that the sea may become calm for us?"—for the sea was becoming increasingly stormy. He said to them, "Pick me up and throw me into the sea. Then the sea will become calm for you, for I know that on account of me this great storm has come upon you." However, the men rowed desperately to return to land but they could not, for the sea was becoming even stormier against them.

As we read the book of Jonah, we know that Jonah was rebelling against what God had instructed him to do. The only way for the storm to be calmed, in that case, was for the men to throw him overboard. But, of course, they did not want to do it because they were afraid that his blood would be on their hands, so they rowed even harder. However, we know that God had a much bigger plan. Have you ever tried to resist the will of God? You might not do it outright, but when we carry our burdens around and try to fix things ourselves, it's like trying to row to shore in an impossible storm. Psalm 55:22 says, "Cast your burden upon the Lord and He will sustain you; He will never allow the righteous to be shaken." Worry and misplaced trust are extra weights that can sink ships. As we sail this sea of faith, may we toss those overboard and trust the one who can calm the sea. He may not calm it when we would like, but if we believe He's in control and trust in Him alone, our hearts can be made calm as we rest in His presence

Matthew 18: 15-17

- Moreover if your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he hears you, you have gained your brother.
- But if he will not hear, take with you one or two more, that 'by the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established.'
- And if he refuses to hear them, tell it to the church. But if he refuses even to hear the church, let him be to you like a heathen and a tax collector.

- Effectively and appropriately communicates with students, parents, staff, and administration in a clear and timely manner

- Accepts and respects each student and assists them in reaching their fullest potential
- Exhibits the fruits of the Spirit in their relationships with others
