Preschool for the Fall of 2022-23

Heartland Christian School is gauging interest for launching a preschool program for students ages three and four years old and is looking for students interested in applying:
We currently serve grades K5-12, but we are considering expanding to include a three- and four-year old program. Our mission is to provide an excellent education from a thoroughly Christian perspective that will engage the students academically and help them spiritually, as well.
Our goal for this program for the three and four year old students is to prepare them for Kindergarten. We don't want to be just another daycare that babysits children, but a preschool that prepares each student for the next level. We will focus on students' learning their letters, numbers, and phonics to get a basis of reading. This will enable each of the students have a leg up on their entrance into Kindergarten.

Applicants for the K3 program will need to be 3 years of age by August 1, 2022 and potty trained. Half-day tuition will be \$4,419/year, and full-day tuition would be \$6,905/year. Please, contact us through the school office or the inquiry request on our website if you are interested.

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I cannot believe that we are just a few weeks from the end of school. Each teacher and administrator has mixed feelings about the end of a school year. Some are excited about the upcoming time off while others will miss the students and would rather just have a short break and keep going. This year has been amazing. We saw our enroll-

ment rise by 10% at the start of the second semester! Our sports teams did well at the state tournaments. Best of all, we have had several students profess their belief in Jesus Christ!

Pastor McCubbin is finishing up his first full year here at Heartland. I am very excited about the direction that the school is headed! Thank you to each

of you for the support of the school and myself. Your prayers are definitely coveted.
